Parent Feedback

Last week we held open afternoons where we invited you in to support your child with target setting this term. It was really nice to welcome many of you to work with your child. As part of the visit we asked you for some feedback so that we can continue to improve. Please see results below:

79% of you said our learning environment was excellent

74% of you said we were excellent at engaging our learners

74% of you said we were excellent at communicating with families

72% said our learning resources were excellent

There was also some general feedback given for further supports around literacy and numeracy. We will work on this and let you know our plans to support very soon. Thank you for your valuable feedback.

YMI (Youth Music Initiative) Sessions

As part of their music lessons our P1-P3/4 classes will have a music teacher every Thursday for this term. Mrs Wilkinson will support classes up the school after the Easter break. We welcome her to our team.

Some of our upper school children are being supported by a Music teacher from Eastbank Academy – Ms White – who is teaching woodwind and brass instruments every Wednesday afternoon. We welcome her to our school too.

Clyde River Foundation

This year our P5/6 children are working with Clyde River Foundation to nurture a school of fish (brown trout) within their classroom. They will learn about what it takes to look after living animals and the part they have to play in keeping our waterways pollution free before releasing the fish into the Clyde.
