#### **Parent Pay**

Please continue to preselect your child's meal each night/morning for the day/week ahead. This will help reduce time spent in classes doing this. The new menus for meal selection are also available on our website.

Please ensure you have signed up to parent pay as all monies needed for school will be paid via here  as well as registration for after school clubs. We are delighted that 94% of our parents/carers are signed up already.

## **Parent Portal**

Last term we used Parent Portal for booking of Parent Evening appointments. Thank you for your patience with this new system. It worked really well and will be what we use moving forward. We are aware of some feedback regarding different websites for meals, appointments etc but unfortunately this is centrally controlled and not a school-based decision. Parent Portal will be used in August for consent forms and Annual Data Checks so please keep login details handy. We are delighted that 72% of our families are signed up to this – we will continue to support where necessary to ensure everyone has equal access.

## **Energy Drinks**

A reminder that energy drinks are not allowed to be brought into school. These drinks usually contain caffeine which is not appropriate for children. We have had a couple of instances where PRIME energy drink has been seen in the school. Please help us to support children in making healthy choices for their body.

## Parking

A reminder to consider safety of our children and members of our local community when parking around the school at pick up or drop off. We have had a couple of local residents complain again about unsafe parking.

#### Communication

All communication in school will be sent via email or text. Please ensure the school has your most up to date contact details. Information will also be shared via our Twitter channel and through the Parent Council Facebook page.

We now share a new weekly overview every Friday on Twitter. This will show you all of the exciting things happening across the school. We have received positive feedback on this already.

## **Parent's Evening**

It was really lovely to have Parent's Evening at the end of March to share in all of your children's achievements. We had an 86% turnout of parents/carers. We hope to increase on this next session.

### Fundraising

Both the school and the Parent Council try to fundraise throughout the school year to allow children to experience trips, school visits and special treats. At our Dress Down day in March we raised £231.25. This money will be added to school funds for the term ahead. Some things we plan to do this term with school funds are:

## Attendance

As a school we regularly review attendance in each class. We try to support individual families where we can with any barriers to attendance. We want to ensure that every child is in school where possible – it is their right to attend school and our collective responsibility to ensure they can.

Our current school total attendance is 92.72%. Our highest was 97.4% which was in August of last year. Every day at school makes a difference. Please continue to ensure your child attends school as often as physically possible. If you need support with something then please call and let us know. Attendance letters for any pupil sitting below 85% attendance will be sent out in May for further action. We look forward to continuing to support you with this.

#### Latecomings

Can I please remind you that school starts at 9am each morning. It is really important that all children are in school for this time. We understand that there will be the odd morning where life just doesn't happen as quickly as you want it to and you may be running late – these things happen. School gates will close sharper in the morning and children who are late must enter through the office to ensure we are seeing them as they come in to mark them as present.
