Numeracy and Maths

In Term 3, we will use our prior knowledge of multiplication and division, we will apply this to complete word problems, fractions and decimals. It is important that we are fluent in our times tables. We will investigate the order of operations using BODMAS. We will continue our learning about time using 24hour and 12 hour notations, incorporating work on local bus/train timetables.
