Numeracy and Maths

In Term 1, we will continue to revise learned strategies to ensure we are confident in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

We will also be focussing on <u>place value</u>, <u>number processes and time</u>. Some key phrases we will be using are:

- negative
- decimal
- place value column
- multiples and factors



You can support this at home by:

- Accessing Mathsframe and Topmarks online. Your child is familiar with these sites and there are many activities appropriate to your child's level.
- Talk about money and how the pence is equivalent to a decimal place. Can they add and subtract money? Can they help you calculate a total?
- Set challenges at home to revise multiplication facts e.g.
 cooking nuggets for 4 people, each person is to get 4 nuggets,
 how many nuggets should they cook?

Literacy

This term in Literacy we will be exploring:

- Explanation writing
- Skimming and scanning



- Extracting info from a text
- Creating questions on a text
- Exploring new words and phrases
- Spelling rules and patterns

You can support this at home by:

- Reading daily. Newspaper, magazine, comic, fiction or non-fiction book.
- Practise talking and listening skills. You could time each other to see who can talk the longest about a subject.
- Highlight and use a dictionary/iPad to find the meaning of new words in texts at home/ in the environment
- Revise skimming and scanning, can your child find a specific bit of info from an article?
- Play true, false, can't tell after reading or watching a show.

Other Curricular Areas

In IDL, we are going to be exploring the Identity, Society and Equality. This will include research and learning alongside our class novel 'Divided City' which covers themes of sectarianism, discrimination, equality and togetherness.

In Music, we will be working with Celtic Connections to learn Scots songs. We will be reflecting on how different types of music can make us feel and will be using our bodies as percussion to keep beat and rhythm.

In French, we are revising greetings and introductions and will be learning how to ask and answer questions.

You can support at home by asking your child about their learning and gathering info to support their research. Your own experiences of discrimination would be invaluable to give children an insight into how these themes impact people in real time.
