Welcome to the annual report from the Parent Council of Riverbank Primary School.

This is the first report since the school has been open and that the Parents Council has been established, written by the chair to provide an overview of some of the important work that we have undertaken over the year.

The role of the Parent Council is to give a voice to all parents and carers (collectively known as the 'Parent Forum'). We work closely with the head teacher and other school staff to solve general issues raised by parents; to help make decisions that affect parents and children; and to communicate the school's aims and practices to parents. Parents are reminded that they are welcome to attend any meeting of the Parent Council. Alternatively, if there is a problem you wish to be discussed or a suggestion you would like to make, you can approach any member of the Parent Council about it. We are always keen to recruit new members of Parent Council and we recommend it as a rewarding, enjoyable and useful activity.

Overview of activities in 2020

As a result of Covid there were no events held by the Parents Council but as a group we applied for funding and were successful in grants of approx £10K – Lottery, £250 Greggs, £400 Neighbourly and £9050 GCC Partnership Funding.

We have used this in the following of ways:

- Farmfood vouchers to support families
- Larders (of basic foods) at both Riverbank and Silverdale Nursery
- Power card top ups
- Activity bags for children
- Formula
- Supported the local Foodbank (North East Foodbank)
- Individual support for families.
- Purchased the P7 Leavers hoodies and hosted a pizza (Socially distanced) leavers gathering.
- We have also been involved in the Recovery Plan (Q&A) with the Director of Education and John Swinney (Education Minister) and we are represented within the Glasgow City Parents Group which is a city wide action group that works with GCC and represents families.

What we hope to achieve in this 2020/21 school years

- Consultation with parents/families on involvement and engagement with PC
- Innovative ways to celebrate (within the COVID restrictions)
- Continue to offer some financial support to families
- Establish a pupil participation and engage more with school children.
- Grow a £1 initiative with the upper school
- Traffic / Parking Improvement Plan.

Parent Council meetings

Parent Council held regular meetings in 2019/20 (August, September, October, December, January, February and then through zoom March, April, May and June) and will host an Annual General Meeting (AGM) in November. Tommy Hynes, the head teacher, was able to attend every meeting.
