Numeracy and Maths

In Term 3, we are revisiting our times table knowledge in order to divide whole numbers and with remainders. We will also be looking at decimals and fractions in their various forms.

Some key phrases we will be using are:

- remainder
- denominator
- decimal point

- Work on quick recall of times tables facts.
- Use terminology like half or quarter of items.

Literacy

This term in Literacy we will be exploring:

- Explanation writing
- Reading fiction texts



- Reading for enjoyment
- Grammar and tools for writing
- Partner and group discussions

You can support this at home by:

- Reading daily. Newspaper, magazine, comic, fiction or non-fiction book.
 After reading can they summarise what they have read and give a review.
- Practise talking and listening skills. You could time each other to see who can talk the longest about a subject.
- Watch Newsround or educational programmes such as those about animals and talk about what they have learned and what they might want to know about.

Other Curricular Areas

In IDL, we are going to be exploring Scotland and our local area. This will include researching and learning about the significant people, places and things that feature in our country and area. We will be incorporating Art, Technologies and Social Subject into this topic.

In Science we will be focussing on learning about light and sounds waves. We will learn about where these are found and how they are used. We will further explore our 5 senses and the workings of these in our bodies.

In French children will be learning vocabulary to support daily tasks such as the date, weather and greetings

Health and Wellbeing

P6b have PE on a Tuesday and a Wednesday. We will try to take sessions outdoors if we can.

In P.E. we will be focussing on Scottish traditional dancing and Hockey.

Please ensure your child has their full P.E. kit, including footwear, on these days. All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons.

Staff are not allowed to remove earrings so if your child cannot take these out then please take them out before coming to school.

We use our daily emotions check-in to express our feelings throughout the day. We will continue to explore these through two PATHS lessons each week. Our PATHS lessons this term will focus on overcoming obstacles and joining in with others.

In our RSHP (Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood) lessons we are looking at what is love and stereotypes, equality and being fair and emotional wellbeing: feeling sad/worried.
